



## **Frederick Flying Cows Dominate in High-scoring Home Victory**

After a strong season opener, the Flying Cows kept their momentum rolling, lighting up the scoreboard in a dominant 142-108 victory over the Jersey Shore Breaks.

Both teams came out firing, pushing the tempo and trading early buckets. Tavares Sledge set the tone by drilling a three to open the game, while Joe Bradshaw brought relentless energy on the defensive end. Bradshaw also had a monster first half offensively, dropping 20 points and pulling down 17 rebounds.

The Breaks found success attacking the paint early, but foul trouble disrupted their rhythm. Meanwhile, the Cows leaned on Sledge's perimeter shooting and transition offense to build a 77-62 halftime lead. Captain of the Breaks, Mason Jones led the Breaks with 15 first-half points, keeping them within striking distance.

The third quarter proved decisive as the Cows exploded offensively, stretching their lead to 19. Jersey Shore struggled to keep pace as the Cows relentless attack buried them in the second half.

Undrafted rookie Joe Bradshaw continued his breakout performance, posting a dominant double-double with 29 points and 17 rebounds. Tavares Sledge remained a steady force, shooting an impressive 72% from the field and finishing with 21 points. Ronald Scott added an efficient 21, going perfect from inside the arc.

Veteran guard Damien Daniels played a key role in the Flying Cows' dominant win, dishing out 10 assists and helping control the tempo. After the game, he spoke about the team's mindset and second-half adjustments. "This win does great things for the locker room, but we've been here before, and as a team, we don't want to get complacent," Daniels said, emphasizing the importance of staying focused despite the strong start. When asked about adjustments after halftime, he highlighted the team's physical advantage. "We looked at our size advantage and tried to get the ball inside to force them to foul us."

The Cows flexed their depth, with five players scoring 20-plus points. Their transition game was unstoppable, racking up 30 fast break points while forcing 19 turnovers. They also dominated the glass, out rebounding the Breaks 53-29. Two games in, the Flying cows are off to a red hot start.

Despite a strong first half, the Breaks couldn't withstand the Cows' offensive explosion, surrendering 65 second-half points. Christopher Lyons led Jersey Shore with 22 points, but their early momentum faded. Seth Compass, forward for the Breaks also had a great individual performance scoring 22 points and five total rebounds.
