Flying Cows Dominate Again, Move to 8-0 with 118-97 Win Over Virginia Valley Vipers

The Flying Cows continued their undefeated season with a commanding 118-97 victory over the Virginia Valley Vipers, relinquishing the lead only once early in the 1st Quarter.

Quentin Scott, the league's leading scorer and a former Flying Cow, made an emotional return against his old team, showcasing why he's one of the most prolific scorers with the ball in his hands. Despite Scott's ability to create and convert tough shots, he faced relentless defense from Damien Daniels, who always brings his signature defensive presence. Daniels had a strong outing on that end of the floor, making Scott work for every bucket, but Scott's talent still shined through in key moments. Scott racked up 26 points. Daniels was able to get 5 points, 7 assists, and a steal.

The Cows came out aggressive, pushing the pace and racking up fast-break points, particularly in the paint. However, Virginia Valley's captain, Michael Brown, wasted no time making an impact. His early shot-making set the scene for a big night, finishing with 30 points and 3 assists.

Both teams turned up the heat in the second quarter, leading to a flurry of points and turnovers. Tavares Sledge played a key role for the Cows, contributing on both ends of the floor, he walked away with 13 points, 12 rebounds, and 7 assists. While "Putback King" Javon Adams dominated the glass and tallied 8 first-half points.

The high-intensity quarter saw the Cows build a sizable 50-32 lead before the Vipers fought to cut the deficit to 58-45 at halftime.

After the break, the Flying Cows maintained control, keeping a 20-point cushion throughout much of the quarter. The dynamic duo of Martavian Payne and Javon Adams put on a show, Payne's mid range shooting led to an efficient 27 points on 70.6% shooting, while Adams powered his way to 31 points and an impressive 19 rebounds, generating plenty of second-chance opportunities.

By the end of the third, the Cows had stretched their lead to 93-70.

The Vipers frustrations came to a head late in the game, with Dorian Benford Jr. picking up a costly technical foul. Benford ends his game with 5 points, 2 rebounds, and 4 turnovers. Despite the rough outing, the Vipers can take solace in the strong play of Quentin Scott, the league's leading scorer, who continued to shine. Scott end's his day with 26 points, 2 steals, and 1 rebound. Hope is not lost as they

have the league leading scorer in the league. The Vipers will need to clean up their turnovers and refocus as they lick their wounds and bounce back again on Saturday at home against the Flying Cows.
