

## Flying Cows Keep the Streak Alive in Jersey 118-103

The Flying Cows came out of the midseason break locked in and laser-focused, keeping their perfect record intact with a 118-103 road win over the Jersey Shore Breaks, who fall to 2-13 on the season. Despite the record mismatch, this one had some fire to it, especially early on.

Jersey Shore started fast, jumping out to a 7-2 lead behind some energetic rebounding and fast tempo. The Cows responded by forcing three early turnovers to swing momentum their way and narrow the gap to 14-13.

The Breaks guard Julius Coles made an immediate impact in his debut, dropping 10 first-quarter points, helping the home squad set the pace. Damien Daniels kept the Cows in the mix with 8 points and 2 assists in the opening frame, including a deep three that ignited a flurry of traded triples from both squads in the final five minutes. Jersey Shore won the glass early, out-rebounding the Flying Cows 15-9 in the quarter, a rare sight. Both teams were tied at 34 at the end of 1 quarter.

The scoring stayed hot, with both teams firing from deep and pushing in transition. The Breaks sporadic shooting from beyond the arc played right into the Cows hands, who turned long rebounds into fast-break points. A mid-quarter scoring run was capped off by a two-hand slam from Kyle Steward, who contributed 16 points, 6 rebounds, and 3 assists during the game and helped stretch the Flying Cows lead to a game-high 11 before halftime.

The Breaks responded by tightening up defensively and trimming the lead to 7 with five minutes to go in the third. But every time the Breaks made a push, someone from the Cows answered.

One of the unsung heroes of today was none other than Javon Adams. The do-it-all forward made every minute count, finishing with 23 points, 10 rebounds, 5 assists, and a highlight alley-oop slam that turned momentum back in the Cows favor. Flying Cows ended the quarter with a 14-point cushion. Tavares Sledge, the seasoned leader, quietly handled business in the fourth. He finished with 19 points and 7 rebounds, staying composed as Jersey Shore tried to speed the game up with fast breaks. Martavian Payne poured in 25 points and grabbed 5 rebounds, showcasing his scoring versatility and making key plays on both ends of the floor.

Chris Smith, the Breaks All-Star, showed why he's a problem, finishing with 25 points and 6 rebounds, but the Cows defense kept his teammates in check down the stretch. Coles had a solid debut, finishing with 16 points, while John Green also debuted with 7 rebounds and 2 steals for Jersey Shore. Despite the Breaks best effort to close the gap, the Flying Cows never let up the lead after halftime. Jersey Shore may be 2-13, but they're developing chemistry. With Coles and Green now in the mix and Chris Smith continuing to lead the charge, they're a team that's building toward something.
