Flying Cows Blow Past the Seahawks in Another Statement Win 127-93

The Flying Cows rolled into A.C. Jordan Arena, home of the Capital Seahawks, with their eyes locked on 16-0. And today, they looked every bit like the top team in the TBL. Facing off against a well-rounded Capital Seahawks squad, this highly anticipated Mid-Atlantic showdown lived up to the hype. The Flying Cows came out on top in commanding fashion, winning 127–93.

The Cows had a clear game plan from the start: lock down All-Star Andre Fox. Doubling him on every touch, they forced the Seahawks to rely on their supporting cast. Fox still managed 10 points in the opening quarter, but the strategy disrupted the Seahawks rhythm. After falling behind by their largest deficit of the night, six points, Javon Adams swung the momentum with a powerful dunk, capping off a 9-0 Flying Cows run that flipped the script. The young talent finished with 41 points, 10 rebounds, 3 steals, and 17 for 19 from the field. Another dominant performance from a rising star in the TBL.

The Cows defensive intensity was undeniable, forcing 7 turnovers in the first quarter alone. Martavian Payne led the charge, picking pockets and pushing the pace. He finished with 11 points, 4 assists, and 2 steals, proving he's more than just a scoring threat. Right beside him, veteran forward Tavares Sledge made his presence felt, adding 10 points, 8 rebounds, 6 assists, and 2 steals in a well-rounded showing.

The second quarter saw veteran Ed Dyson inject fresh energy off the bench. The savvy scorer sparked the offense with timely buckets, finishing the game with 26 points and 5 assists.

Just before halftime, Javon Adams buried a deep three at the buzzer, sending the bench into a frenzy and the Flying Cows into the break with a commanding 58-46 lead.

During the third quarter, the Flying Cows maintained their double-digit lead despite the Seahawks pushing the pace and trying to shoot their way back. Chris Braswell knocked down a three and dished out an assist to try and get Capital going, but the Cows responded each time. Their poise on both ends helped them keep the tempo and head into the final quarter up 90-75.

In the fourth, veteran guard Damien Daniel certainly helped seal the deal. He delivered 16 points, 6 assists, and 2 steals, keeping the offense humming. Joe Bradshaw added 14 points and 7 rebounds, with relentless hustle that energized the entire team. As the lead ballooned, the Seahawks looked defeated, and the Flying Cows cruised to a dominant 127-93 victory.

Now 16-0, Coach Ed Corporal's squad continues to display elite depth, discipline, and determination, one game closer to clinching the Mid-Atlantic Division. Capital, still second in the standings at 11-5, remains a playoff threat when clicking, but on this night, Coach Corporal's blueprint left no doubt. The Flying Cows are red hot and look every bit like a team destined for a deep postseason run.

Next up, the Flying Cows return to action on May 3rd at Hood College to face the Crusaders. Then, on May 4th, they take on the Jersey Shore Breakers. Fans can also enjoy the Barnyard Bash from 2 to 4 PM before that game, with live music and fun for all ages. The action continues May 9th, when the Virginia Valley Vipers come to town.
